

MCNALLY COMMUNITY CENTRE RESTRICTIONS EXEMPTION PROGRAM

Overview

The Restrictions Exemption Program (REP) permits McNally Community Association to operate without the majority of public health restrictions in CMOH Order 42-2021.

McNally Community Association's REP includes artists/artisans musicians who rent the facility on a monthly basis, groups that utilize the facility on a weekly basis and event rentals such as wedding and funeral receptions.

The purpose of the REP is to promote Covid-19 vaccination as part of a public health strategy. The privacy of all tenants, patrons and attendees will be respected.

Good public health practices are always encouraged, and can minimize transmission of respiratory infections, including COVID-19, influenza and common colds. These practices include: immunization, proper hand washing or use of hand sanitizer, respiratory etiquette, and enhanced cleaning and disinfecting. In addition, staying home when sick with COVID-19 symptoms is legally required even if a test is not done.

General

This Restrictions Exemption Program (REP) allows McNally Community Association to carry out operations and is in alignment with the province's protocols for opting in to the program.

In order for tenants, patrons and attendees to access the facility, one of the following are required for entry:

- **Proof of vaccination**
- *For wedding and funeral receptions ONLY an original (non-copied) medical exemption letter, or*
- *Proof of a negative privately-paid test result from a sample that is taken within the prior 72 hours (Results from Alberta Health Services are not eligible for consideration for this program).*

Please note:

- Face masks are required in all indoor public spaces within the facility.
- Social distancing of 2 meters must be observed whenever possible.
- Individuals who have COVID-19 symptoms must not enter the facility.

Screening Process	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• All tenants, patrons and attendees must provide one of the following to a member of McNally Community Association or agent at the point of entry:<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Proof of vaccination; or• For wedding or funeral receptions ONLY, an original (non-copied) medical exemption letter.• For wedding or funeral receptions ONLY proof of a negative privately-paid test result from a sample that is taken within the prior 72 hours (Results from Alberta Health Services are not eligible for consideration for this program), or• Individuals 18 years or older must produce valid personal identification as defined in the personal ID section below.<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Individuals who are under the age of 18 do not need to show personal identification.• At minimum:<ul style="list-style-type: none">• The name and the date of birth of the individual listed on the proof of immunization or testing must be matched with the name and date of birth on the identification (for 18+).• Verification that the proof of vaccination is appropriate (see below) OR the test result (wedding or funeral reception ONLY) indicates the individual has tested negative for COVID-19 within the last 72 hours (see below), or the medical exemption letter is an original and in the prescribed form.
Valid Proof of Vaccination	<p>Tenants, patrons and attendees seeking entry to McNally Community Centre are solely responsible for demonstrating that they are the legitimate holder of the vaccination record, and that the information being provided is complete and accurate.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• If they cannot demonstrate that to the satisfaction of McNally Community Association, the individual will not be allowed to enter.• Abuse of the McNally Community member or agent will not be tolerated. <p>Proof of vaccination includes:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• A picture or paper record of a valid Alberta Health Services, MyHealth Records, pharmacy, First Nations, or physician immunization record prominently displaying the name, type of vaccine and date of administration, or• Canadian armed forces immunization record, displaying the name, type of vaccine and date of administration, or• An immunization record from another Canadian Province or Territory, displaying the name, type of vaccine and date of administration, or• Valid Government of Alberta Vaccination QR code (when available).

Valid proof of vaccination continued	<p>In the case of recent vaccination, the date of administration of the last required dose in the series must be at least fourteen days prior to the date the tenants, patrons or attendees are seeking access to the center.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• <i>Please be advised that partial vaccination will not be accepted for entry into the facility.</i> <p>For international travelers, the ArriveCan app code and a valid international travel identification document is acceptable.</p>
Valid proof of a negative test result	<p>For wedding and funeral receptions ONLY:</p> <p>The test result should be a written or printed copy that indicates the individual has tested negative for COVID-19 on a Health Canada approved rapid antigen, rapid PCR, or lab based PCR test approved by Health Canada or the lab accreditation body of jurisdiction.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• It must clearly outline the laboratory that completed the test if applicable e.g., DynaLIFE , the type of test, time of sample collection, and clear indication of a negative result.• A picture of a rapid test result taken off-site is not sufficient for this purpose.• Individuals must not bring completed rapid tests or self-tests to operators, as they can pose a communicable disease risk.• Testing must not be sourced from the Alberta Health Services public COVID-19 testing system.<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ This system is currently reserved for symptomatic individuals and those in outbreak situations. If an individual has COVID-19 symptoms, they must isolate. <p>McNally Community Association will NOT offer on-site rapid testing.</p>
Valid medical exemption	<p>A valid medical exemption is the original signed letter from a physician or nurse practitioner that includes:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• The name of the person in the written documentation that matches the identification provided.• The physician's or nurse practitioner's information is complete and includes the name, phone number, contact information, professional registration number, and signature of the physician or nurse practitioner; a statement that there is a medical reason for the individual's exemption from being fully vaccinated against COVID-19 and the duration of the exemption.

COVID-19 INFORMATION

Valid personal ID	<p>Individuals who are 18 years of age or older must present personal ID</p> <p>Proof of identity can be established using documentation issued by an institution or public body, provided it includes the name of the holder and date of birth.</p> <p>Examples of identification documents that may be used to confirm the identity of the holder of the vaccine receipt include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Birth certificate,• Citizenship card,• Driver s license,• Government of Alberta or other issued identification card, including health card,• Metis card, Treaty card, Inuit Status card, or• Passport, or• Permanent resident card. <p>Photo identification is not required.</p>
Collecting and storing personal information	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Studio tenants will be required to indicate their vaccine status one time.• Members of the choir, the figure drawing group, the cloggers, the bridge players, the glass artisans and any other groups with fixed membership will be required to indicate their vaccine status one time.• Instructors of fitness classes will be required to submit a list of participants and must contact McNally Community Association staff to check vaccination status. This will be done ONE TIME. Drop-ins or changes in participant lists will not be allowed.
Participation and application	<p>Upon implementation of this program it will be operated consistently and throughout the facility.</p> <p>The program will operate in all areas of the building 24 hours day/7 days week. We would ask that tenants and club groups such as the choir and the glass artisans assist the association in gathering vaccine status data by sharing meeting dates and events.</p> <p>Should McNally Community Association wish to exit the program, tenants patrons and attendees will be notified through posters, on the website or by email.</p>
Workers and contractors	<p>Employees, contractors, repair workers, delivery workers, volunteers, inspectors or others who are entering the business for work purposes and not as patrons are not required to be screened.</p>
